Williams questions if, he did in fact get dressed up, in hues of the moon, if that effort of preparation might carry him somewhere other than where he is currently at. We have the opportunity to question where our preparation might carry us. The good news about our efforts is that it might not have been as thorough as we would have liked but God is still at work. The author rightly invokes the image of a wandering moon in relation to us humans as wanderers. Interestingly the moon's trajectory is not a completely arbitrary pathway. Likewise, the journeys we go on do not have purely arbitrary pathways to go down. God is at work with a plan and pathways in our lives. Even when we disregard God's leading, God still works with us. Witness and believe the good news of the Gospel. because of Christ's birth, life, death, and especially his resurrection...
