ASSURANCE OF PARDON

Hughes is championing a freedom that is tied up in the freedom of others. Freedom means that he can rest. Hughes states that he can't live on tomorrow's bread, he can't live with something he does not yet have. He needs, we need, bread today, bread for tomorrow, and the knowledge that each day we will have our daily bread from God. This is the promise of God to the Israelites who have been led out of bondage into the wilderness, bread for today and everyday. Even when we lose focus on this promise and start chasing more than we need, God loves us, God has grace for us. Witness and believe the good news of the Gospel: because of Christ's birth, life, death, and especially his resurrection...

NEW TESTAMENT READING

Galatians 3:23-29

Now before faith came, we were imprisoned and guarded under the law until faith would be revealed. Therefore the law was our disciplinarian until Christ came, so that we might be justified by faith. But now that faith has come, we are no longer subject to a disciplinarian, for in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith. As many of you as were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus. And if you belong to Christ, then you are Abraham's offspring, heirs according to the promise.

OLD TESTAMENT READING

Exodus 16:16-23

This is what the Lord has commanded: "Gather as much of it as each of you needs, an omer to a person according to the number of persons, all providing for those in their own tents." ' The Israelites did so, some gathering more, some less. But when they measured it with an omer, those who gathered much had nothing over, and those who gathered little had no shortage; they gathered as much as each of them needed. And Moses said to them, 'Let no one leave any of it over until morning.' But they did not listen to Moses; some left part of it until morning, and it bred worms and became foul. And Moses was angry with them. Morning by morning they gathered it, as much as each needed; but when the sun grew hot, it melted.

On the sixth day they gathered twice as much food, two omers apiece. When all the leaders of the congregation came and told Moses, he said to them, 'This is what the Lord has commanded: "Tomorrow is a day of solemn rest, a holy sabbath to the Lord; bake what you want to bake and boil what you want to boil, and all that is left over put aside to be kept until morning." '


